REPORT OF THE MAYOR AND ACTING SERVICE DIRECTOR: Mayor MAYOR Hruby reported the bittersweet receipt of the notice of retirement of Finance Director Virginia Price at the end of March. Mayor Hruby attended a rally for the Brecksville schools called Love for BBH. Some students contacted Mayor Hruby and the Superintendent of the school district regarding the tragedies that have happened in schools recently. Mayor Hruby said the rally was designed to talk about the communities' feelings and sentiments toward the students. The speakers did a wonderful job as well as the choirs and students. This event is the beginning of a program headed by Jennifer Simmick along with the BBH School District and Broadview Heights.

Senator Portman called Mayor Hruby to notify him of the signature, on the deed, of the Secretary of Veterans Affairs, authorizing the sale of the VA Property to the City for \$1.00. It was announced 23 years ago of the possible closure of the VA hospital in Brecksville. The City rezoned the property immediately, removing the community facility zoning, fearing another federal agency would use the property. In 2012 the hospital closed. The City's bicentennial year. Mayor Hruby thanked City Council for their support, Larry Potla, Greg Skaljic and Council President Harwood. Paul Grau as Law Director did an outstanding job directing the City for the eventual acceptance of the property. Law Director Matty and Assistant Law Director DiGeronimo also worked diligently toward this goal. Mayor Hruby thanked Ed Bradley of the VA Administration for an understanding that was struck on Thanksgiving Day in 2016. Mayor Hruby thanked Director Susan Fuehrer for her support. Director Fuehrer took over the Louis Stokes VA Medical Center in Cleveland, during a troubled time and worked. Mayor Hruby had fears over the years that the City may have taken on more than the administration could handle. Mayor Hruby said countless developers wanted the City to accept full responsibility for any environmental issues and clearing the property. Mayor Hruby said a local developer, Kevin DiGeronimo, negotiated with the City and is willing to assume the responsibilities which may cost as much as 8-10 million dollars.

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DiGeronimo Development is allowing the City the authority to decide how the property is developed. Mayor Hruby thanked Mr. DiGeronimo for that agreement. Mr. DiGeronimo is a resident and the DiGeronimo Companies have served the Cleveland area well for many years. Mr. DiGeronimo's commitment to the City of Brecksville is greatly appreciated. Mayor Hruby thanked DiGeronimo and City Council for the MOU. The hearings and development will continue in the public for the betterment of the City. **MAYOR, CONTINUED**

COMMENTS: Councilmember Redinger thanked Mayor Hruby for the efforts put forth at the Brecksville Broadview Heights School rally today. Councilmember Redinger said as a parent to students in the district, she felt the rally was very well done. **COMMENTS**

Councilmember Rose commended Mayor Hruby for his leadership, persistence and love for the City. The accomplishment will be looked upon as an example for urban governments and city planners. 
