

SUPPLEMENTAL INDEX TO BRECKSVILLE SESQUICENTENNIAL HISTORY

The original index did not index the appendices. This index includes Appendices I-VII, X-XI. It also excludes Appendices VIII-IX [high school graduates for 1960 and 1961] since that information can be found in the alumni directory of Brecksville High School. The supplemental index also includes some additional entries from the text [pages 1-94] which was covered by the original index.

There are two parts to the index, namely, a personal name index and an index for other subjects, including place names.

Please note that it is possible that the term being indexed may occur more than once on a page.
