Subject: The latest news for you

For several months the City of Brecksville has been under a Confidentiality Agreement with Sherwin Williams.

The morning of February 6, 2020, Sherwin Williams issued a Press Release announcing that they will remain in the Greater Cleveland area. Their Corporate Headquarters will remain in a new facility to be constructed in downtown Cleveland. They will construct a new Research and Development Center within the City of Brecksville.

This is obviously an excellent opportunity for our community in many ways. We are very grateful to Sherwin Williams and their representatives who we were privileged to partner with during our discussions. With their announcement we are assured our partnership will be a long standing relationship.

Quote that was included in SW Press Release February 6, 2020:

"We are excited about Sherwin-Williams plans, which would bring an infusion of jobs and additional tax revenue into our community", says Brecksville Mayor Jerry Hruby. "We believe the new R&D center in Brecksville would be a catalyst to attract increased office, residential, hospitality and retail investment."

We also express our sincere appreciation to the DiGeronimo Companies, the city developers for Valor Acres. Their involvement with this property was very beneficial and integral in presenting our city for this project.

The city's CIC (Community Investment Corporation) has an Agreement with Crowland, Inc (Dalad Group) to purchase their property which is adjacent to Valor Acres. The 88 acre parcel is under an agreement for six months to purchase this land after the CIC performs its due diligence. The joint development of these two properties in a single overall development plan provides the city with many options and expanded opportunities.

On February 1st, the City took control of the Former Central School and adjoining Residential Property along with the Stadium Drive Athletic Field which the Brecksville Broadview Heights City School District transferred to the city in exchange for a 25 acre parcel at Blossom Hill. The first step to be taken by the city is to contract with outside consultants for a Phase I Environmental Study and Asbestos Survey at Central School. City Council will consider authorizing these services at its Regular Meeting on February 18, 2020.
