TRIKE AND BIKE BRECKSVILLE 2022

Saturday August 13th from 9am-1pm at the Blossom Hill Complex we are excited to be hosting our inaugural Trike and Bike event here in Brecksville! Trike and Bike, benefitting Velosano, is a series of community organized bike rides for children ages 3-12. These rides provide children with an opportunity to experience what it feels like to give back to others by challenging them to fundraise for pediatric cancer research at Cleveland Clinic. 100% of the proceeds will support the cause. In addition to the critical support that is raised for research Trike & Bike teaches valuable lessons centered on fun, fitness and philanthropy.

This year's ride is dedicated to **Raegan Papp** whose journey was cut far too short. CITY HALL TENNIS COURT

At the July 19th City Council meeting, an Ordinance authorizing the Source Well Contract purchase and installation from Musco Sports Lighting, LLC of a new Light-Structure System for the Brecksville Tennis Courts located behind City Hall was approved. Grant funding that was awarded to the City through State Senator Dolan and the State of Ohio Capital Appropriations Budget will provide a \$75,000.00 reimbursement toward this project. This project is currently set to commence in October.



CHIPPEWA CREEK BANK STABILIZATION PROJECT

I am sure the majority of you have seen the construction equipment mobilizing within Brecksville Road, just north of the City Square. This is a Dominion project being completed to facilitate the upcoming Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District (NEORS) Chippewa Creek Bank Stabilization Project at the Millside Centre and most notably near the Creekside Restaurant. After several years of design, Dominion has begun relocating just under 2,000 feet of their high pressure 20 inch gas main. They will be drilling north to an exit point between St. Basil's entrance and exit drives and will then pull the pipe back from that location. Again, this is a Dominion project. Currently, they anticipate completion by September 16th. We will keep the community apprized if the schedule is to change. Please be patient and drive slowly in all construction areas.



VALOR ACRES UPDATE

All of the foundations are complete for the new Sherwin Williams Buildings. The buildings are now under construction and are progressing on schedule.

Valor Acres has begun to market their residential phase of the development. You can check this online if you have an interest. The City is not involved in the marketing of these units, this is simply a notification from the City that DiGeronimo Companies have begun their marketing and sales of the units.





2022 ROAD PROGRAM

The Service Department has completed the paving of Forestview Terrace and Parkview Road. The following are the streets that are scheduled to be paved by our Service Department yet this year:

- Crystal Creek
- Greenhaven (9511-9607)
- Hidden Lake Trail
- Summerwind
- Thortree Drive
- Wiese Road - from Iroquois to Chautauqua
- Whitewood - from Route 21 to Meadow
- Woodbridge Lane
- Woodmill Circle

We again ask you to please move over and slow down when you enter a paving project. Please use caution and watch closely for the directions from the flag men. We are sorry for any inconvenience, however, the outcome will provide good service for over a decade from the new road surface.
